The specific focus can be found below. Identify a CNS that would fit best for each course. You also need to identify a practitioner with whom you can spend 40 hours performing health assessments for the Advanced Health Assessment Course. It is preferred that the practitioner works in the same institution as the preceptor you have identified for CNS II. We will use this information to find preceptors for the CNS clinical practicums and the Advanced Health Assessment practicum and to execute contracts with their sites before the clinical experiences.
