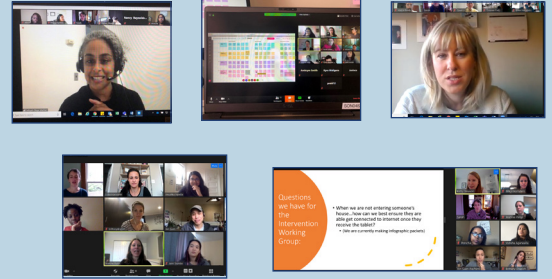

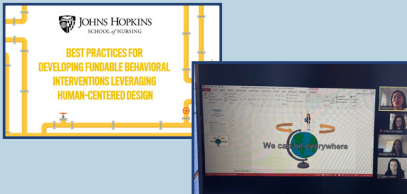

Held on June 8 and 9, the program had 14 participants from 11 institutions. Newly designed sessions introduced participants to human-centered design principles and application.

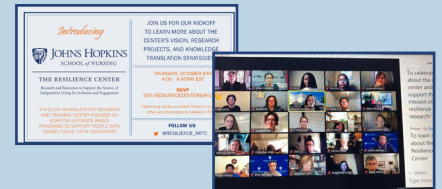

RESILIENCE RRTC Kickoff*



The new **RESILIENCE RRTC**, funded by the National Institute on Disability, Independent Living, and Rehabilitation Research, launched with a kickoff in October that attracted over 50 participants.

The goal of the center is to adapt and scale evidenced-based programs for people living with disabilities and their caregivers.

COVID-19 Coursera Courses

Aging Center faculty and staff developed emergency response courses for assisted living and senior housing staff in partnership with JHSPH. 2,500 learners have enrolled as of publication.
