ANEW Scholars Program

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) has funded more than 50 nursing school to assist them to increase the number of qualified primary care advanced practice nurses and nurse anesthetist prepared to practice in underserved areas and to provide funding and support that would increase nursing education opportunities for individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds and underrepresented in nursing as advanced practice nurses. During July 2017, the Johns Hopkins School of Nursing was notified that their ANEW grant would be funded.

The goals of the JHSON ANEW Scholars Program are to:

- Prepare advanced primary care nurses to practice in underserved settings (urban settings)
- Establish an innovative academic (JHSON) with our practice partner (Johns Hopkins Community Physicians) and establish new partners
- Recruit, train, support practice partners for enhanced clinical immersion

- Educate and graduate APN for care of underserved populations
- Provide APN students with targeted learning experiences that enhance their skills and prepares them to practice in underserved settings
