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Abstract

Pressure injuries (PIs) are a complex and challenging healthcare concern. Today, the interdisciplinary team approach is considered one of the most effective strategies of care delivery for patients with PI. The purpose of this quality improvement project was to create an interdisciplinary team for the management of patients with stage 3, stage 4, and unstageable PIs. The results showed improvement in communication within the interdisciplinary team regarding care of PI patients and staff adherence to the plan of care. In addition, unit-based educational sessions conducted to measure staff knowledge showed an increase in that knowledge, statistically significant at $p < 0.0001$.
