# R<sup>3</sup>: Applying E-PAUSE to an Ethical Problem in the Clinical Setting Simulation©





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**Description:** This module will allow participants to learn and utilize E-PAUSE, a tool designed to assist nurses to explore ethical challenges, act, reflect and consider options when addressing unprofessional behavior. The learners navigate through a case scenario of a patient (Sydnee Jackson) with pancreatic cancer facing difficult decisions. This is a screen-based simulation.

# **Objectives:**

- Review the ANA Code of Ethics for Nurses
- Define moral distress, advance directives
- Apply the elements of E-Pause to an ethical problem in the clinical setting.

# Materials: Use R<sup>3</sup>: Applying E-PAUSE to an Ethical Problem in the Clinical Setting Simulation©

the American Nurses Association Code of Ethics for Nurses, Internet; laptop/computer with headphones for individual use if each person will do it independently

**Preparation**—Review ANA Code of Ethics for Nurses, review article E-PAUSE as applied during the pandemic and R<sup>3</sup>:Applying E-PAUSE to an Ethical Problem in the Clinical Setting Simulation©

### Time:

• 20-30 minutes to review simulation. Debriefing time approximately 20-30 minutes.

# Likely areas of application/course integration:

- Ethics course
- Professionalism course
- Simulation activity
- Clinical post conference activity
- Can be used as a stand-alone module or in series after the module: R<sup>3</sup>:E-Pause a Tool to Address Ethical Challenges.

### **Audiences:**

- Nursing students, practicing nurses
- Ideal for individual use

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### Instructions/Facilitator Guide:

- Learners can view the screen-based simulation independently pre-lecture or if time permits within a set block of time.
- It is important to set a psychologically safe learning environment for discussion.
- Engage learners in active discussion regarding the challenges nurses face when confronted with an ethical problem in the clinical setting.
- Review the details of the case and the scenario of Sydnee Jackson.

# Sample Debriefing for Facilitators

# Begin the class:

- Create a mindful space by starting the session with a few mindful breaths
- · Review norms for respectful engagement
- Do a check in to get a pulse of the group
- Have participants complete R³: Applying E-PAUSE to an Ethical Problem in the Clinical Setting Simulation©
- After completing the module, independently or in a group, engage the participants in a debrief.

### **Debrief**

Facilitators should adjust and adapt these questions as needed for the situation and the participants.

- 1. What was the experience like for you? What feelings or emotions did you notice in yourself?
- 2. In reviewing the letters in E-PAUSE are there any areas of further clarification needed?
- 3. What was the ethical issue in this scenario?
- 4. How can you apply the ANA Code of Ethics for Nursing to your practice
  - a. Shared decision making
  - b. What perspectives of others were important for the nurse to navigate through?
- 5. Review each letter in EPAUSE for learners to discuss details of the scenario.
- 6. How does EPAUSE apply to your clinical practice?
- 7. Describe one take away from this experience to your next challenging clinical scenario.

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


# Additional Activity (optional after debriefing)

- Activity in dyads (allow 15 minutes):
  - Divide participants into pairs
  - Each person will:
    - Describe an ethical situation they encountered in their
    - How the situation made them feel
    - Describe the perspectives of others
    - Describe one action they took and describe resources that were helpful
  - At the conclusion of the sharing, ask each participant to share a new insight about the situation
