Allocation of funds is based on the quality of the proposed research, the future promise of the applicant, and the applicant's research budget. | <u>American Heart Association - 2023 Career Development Award</u> | <p>Supports highly promising healthcare and academic professionals, in the early years of one's first professional appointment, to explore innovative questions or pilot studies that will provide preliminary data and training necessary to assure the applicant's future success as a research scientist.</p> | <p>\$231,000 for 3 years</p> | <p>December 8, 2022</p> | <p>At the time of application, the applicant must hold an MD, PhD, DO, DVM, DDS, or equivalent post-baccalaureate doctoral degree. Postdoctoral fellows are eligible to apply but must have attained faculty appointment by the time of award activation. Investigators who have been awarded NIH K99/R00 or R01 grants are not eligible to apply. The AHA will permit a Career Development Awardee to concurrently hold an NIH K award (other than K99/R00) if there is no budgetary overlap. The awardee must</p> |

| <u>Open Collective Foundation - Repro Grants</u> | Repro Grants is a “fast grants” program, that awards up to \$100K to ambitious research projects aiming to deepen our understanding of the female reproductive system. We are motivated to learn how our bodies work, so we can develop better diagnostics and interventions to improve women's health outcomes and longevity. | \$100,000 | December 17, 2022 | Applicants must be a scientist (PI, PhD student, postdoc, research assistant): Part of an academic or non-profit research organization. Interested in studying female reproductive biology/health. Researchers from other fields are encouraged to propose projects where their expertise could address an important question in female reproductive biology. Researchers outside the US are eligible for funding. |

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| <u>Lloyd's Register Foundation - Perceptions and Experiences of Risk in the COVID Age</u> | Supports projects which are analytical or interventions-based that use data from the World Risk Poll with the aim of improving safety among at-risk demographic groups. | £250,000 | December 31, 2022 | Proposals accepted from anywhere in the world. | <u>Klingenstein Third Generation Foundation - Transformation of Mental Health Care Grant</u> | “Transformation of Mental Health Care” is a program focused on improving access to high quality mental health care for children and adolescents, especially those from low-income families and under-resourced communities, or other marginalized populations that may have limited supports and resources. This includes families that come from diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds and families that live in poverty. | \$100,000/2 years | January 13, 2023 | Academic researchers from universities, research institutions, health systems or other settings that are positioned to provide rigorous high-quality research focused on transforming mental and behavioral health care that improves outcomes for children and adolescents are eligible. Investigators can be at any stage in their career but must have collected enough pilot data to inform the development of the proposed research project and must be well enough established to lead an effort such as this. |

NLN-funded grants promote diversity of research topics and support investigators who demonstrate rigor and innovative approaches to advance the field of nursing education research.
