BACKGROUND

The Johns Hopkins School of Nursing (JHSON) Wald Community Nursing Center was founded in 1994 as the first JHSON faculty directed service-learning program sites in East Baltimore. The Wald Community Nursing Center and Outreach, as it is known today, is one of a few health programs in Baltimore City providing barrier free health and wellness services to low-income, uninsured residents.

The Lillian Wald Center for Community Nursing works with partners to expand community access to wellness programming and promote health literacy and self-management. The Center also works to expand access to entry level health professions through work with local schools.
