

Structural Racism, Structural Resilience, and Health Justice Fellowship

The Johns Hopkins Structural Racial Discrimination and Resilience Collaborative (SRDRC) has a fellowship opportunity for JHSON PhD students interested in conducting research to reduce/eliminate health disparities due to structural racism or those interested in the science of structural resilience.

Overview

The Johns Hopkins Structural Racial Discrimination and Resilience Collaborative (SRDRC) brings together researchers to measure the impact of racial discrimination and structural resilience on health across the life course, and to develop interventions to combat discriminatory structures while reinforcing community resilience. The SRDRC will provide full-tuition and stipend for two academic semesters to outstanding PhD or DNP/PhD students who demonstrate academic achievement and an interest in health equity research. (Note: This fellowship will replace existing funding for tuition and stipend and is not additive) The fellow will work closely with the members of the Johns Hopkins Structural Racial Discrimination and Resilience Collaborative (SRDRC) consisting of faculty members and trainees across Johns Hopkins University, University of California Los Angeles, Columbia University, and Pacific Institute of Research and Education.

Eligibility

Applicants must be a full-time PhD or DNP/PhD student who has successfully completed coursework for the 2nd year in the plan of study for their program and have an interest in reducing/eliminating health disparities due to structural racism or be interested in structural resilience. Students must be in good academic standing and have the support of their PhD or DNP/PhD advisor to pursue this opportunity.

Application Requirements:

The application will include:

- Statement of career objectives/research goals. The statement should be 1 page single spaced.
- Curriculum Vitae
- List of courses completed with grades in the PhD program to date
- Brief letter of support from the faculty advisor/mentor.

*All applicants will be required to meet with the project Principal Investigator for a 15-minute interview

Due Date: The proposal deadline is 5 p.m. Tuesday, October 31, 2023. Decisions and notification regarding selection will be made by November 30, 2023 with a proposed start date of January 2024.
