Sachs Program grantmaking supports innovative arts activities throughout the University of Pennsylvania community, providing funding to Penn faculty, staff, students, departments, programs, and centers.

Grants range in amount, with the largest being \$25,000, and fund a wide variety of activities aligned with the funder's vision to support teaching art, making art, and presenting art, as well as their aim to provide Penn students with increased access to the arts.

Key Program Details:

- **Training Highlights:** From February to June 2024, the CARES program offers an intensive online course, followed by in-person summer training focused on Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) research, mentorship, networking, pilot studies, and professional development.
- **Summer Institute:** This two-week in-person, plus two-week hybrid institute at Yale offers simulation-based training, community-engaged activities, and immersive SDOH research experiences.
- **Travel Support:** Participation in the CARES program is free, and travel funds will be provided to support CARES Scholars attending the Summer Institute.
- **Target Audience:** We encourage applications from nursing scholars at early career stages, including postdoctoral fellows, junior faculty, and faculty new to NIH funding, with an emphasis on those from underrepresented backgrounds.
