Nurse Faculty Loan Program (NFLP) (HRSA-25-070)

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) released a new Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) to increase the number of qualified nursing faculty across the nation.

The [Nurse Faculty Loan Program \(NFLP\)](#) provides low-interest loans and loan cancellation for students who become nurse faculty. NFLP graduates can have up to 85 percent of their student loan canceled, including interest, if they work full-time as nurse faculty at an accredited nursing school for up to four years.

Advanced Practice Registered Nurses who work full-time as preceptors in academic-practice partnerships are also considered faculty under the NFLP, expanding clinical training for nursing students.

HRSA will award **approximately \$25.6 million to up to 80 grantees** over a period of one year.

Eligible applicants are domestic accredited schools of nursing with advanced education nursing programs.
