JHU Notice on NIH Award Submissions

While the situation remains fluid, the university has begun to receive NIH award actions again. Based on these developments, research faculty and staff should proceed as follows:

Proposal submissions - Confirm that the notice of funding opportunity remains unchanged before proceeding with a proposal. Until further guidance is issued, all proposals should be submitted using the university's federally negotiated rates.

Progress Reports/RPPRs - Proceed with all research progress reports without delay.

No-Cost Extensions - The [eRA Commons notification link for processing first-time no-cost extensions](#) has been reactivated. Investigators who are planning to submit for an extension should promptly send requests in accordance with established university procedures. However, investigators should not assume the extension is automatic but instead proceed only after a formal extension is received from NIH.

Carryovers and Prior Approvals – Submit according to current procedures.

Have you been wishing that you had a bit more funding to expand a current study?

The Johns Hopkins Center for AIDS Research is providing an opportunity for individuals who are working on an existing HIV grant to apply for additional funds to add an aim to the study/project. The PI of this application must be a Johns Hopkins faculty member and an [Early-staged investigator](#) as defined by the NIH. The applicant does not need to be the PI of the “parent” study.

Funds Available

We anticipate budgets of \$25,000 - \$35,000, but may consider up to \$50,000 in direct costs, based on the number of fundable applications received. Budgets will be heavily scrutinized and higher budget requests need to be well justified. Indirect costs will be calculated by the CFAR and added at the time of funding. We plan to award up to 6 grants depending upon the number of fundable applications and the budgets of each award. If awarded, **these additional aims must be completed by April 30, 2026.**

- Application due date: **Friday, March 21st**

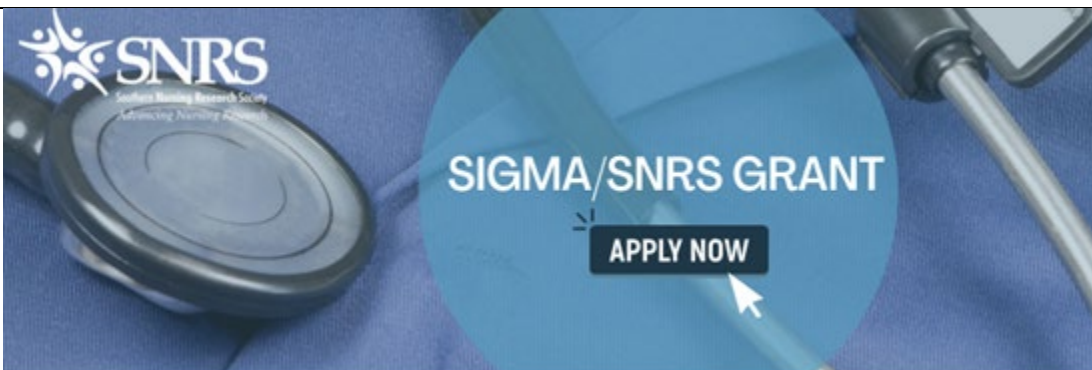
