Dear Hopkins Research Community,

These new programs demonstrate our institution's commitment to ensuring that your research can continue to advance our understanding of the world.

These new programs are not the only resources we provide to our researchers. To that end, I write today to highlight the many other resources available to faculty, specifically early-career faculty. These supports include an array of resources and funding opportunities that our team has developed over the years to support research at Johns Hopkins.

Finally, I would like to invite you to join me and several other University leaders on **May 12 at 2 p.m.** for a community town hall on research resilience. Funding Opportunities and Services for Early-Career Researchers

For early-career researchers, we offer many funding opportunities and services to help you establish your research career. One notable opportunity is the Catalyst Award, which provides \$100,000 in funding. This award is open to researchers in years 3-10 of their tenure track, with the request for applications (RFA) occurring once a year and awards given in June.

Our team curates three databases of funding opportunities for early-career researchers, which are updated monthly. These databases include:

Funding Opportunities and Services for Large Project and Center Grants

If you are seeking funding for large projects and center grants, we offer the [Discovery Award](#), which provides \$150,000 in funding. Discovery Awards are intended to help you generate preliminary results, demonstrate the validity of your hypothesis, and showcase your ability to work on a team.

Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's (RWJF) [Rapid Response Research Awards](#) with a deadline of *Wednesday, May 28, 2025, 3pm ET*. These awards are specifically intended to support early- to mid-career health equity researchers whose racial or Indigenous health equity research was interrupted by federal funding shifts. Funds may cover a wide range of costs that were associated with the original research project.

The Foundation expects to award approximately \$2M in rapid response grants, with awards ranging from \$50k to \$200k for up to 24 months.

There is one application phase in the Rapid Response Research process:

Brief Proposal—Applicants will submit responses to a series of questions through RWJF’s online Application and Review system, including details on how recent federal orders have impacted your research, the gap this funding will address, and how it will build toward advancing racial and Indigenous health equity. Other supplemental information describing the lead organization, original research aim(s) and budget, and resumes or biosketches for key personnel will also be collected. It is anticipated that awards will take approximately four months from submission to be funded.

The TRaC Grant is designed to foster cross-disciplinary partnerships across Johns Hopkins University that will enhance the depth and breadth of research at the Welch Center. Applications that leverage data science and AI through collaboration with investigators in the Whiting School of Engineering and the Data Science and Artificial Intelligence Institute are encouraged.

NIH issued a notice/reminder about longstanding application requirements for projects involving activities outside of the United States or partnerships with international collaborators. In order for NIH to fully assess all foreign activities and collaborations prior to award, the SF-424 R&R Other Project Information Form requires applicants to indicate whether the project involves activities outside of the United States or partnerships with international collaborators.

Updated NIH Policy on Foreign Subawards

The NIH Policy on Foreign Subawards was updated on May 1, 2025. The Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) subaward reporting requirements state that recipients must report on all subawards/subcontracts/consortiums equal to or greater than USD \$30,000. This includes awards that are initially below \$30,000 but subsequent grant modifications result in an award equal to or greater than \$30,000.
